Hair for Heroes event exceeds goals

Organized by paramedic Jess Wilkin, Ms. Wilkin and her DSB paramedic colleagues set out to donate 150 inches of hair to Pantene Beautiful Lengths in honour of Canada's 150th anniversary. Pantene is Canadian-based and donates wigs free of change to Canadians in need. They also set a fundraising goal of \$3,000 to be donated to the Canadian Cancer Society Transportation Program, which supports volunteers who provide rides for cancer patients to and from their cancer related treatments, free of charge.

Manitoulin-Sudbury DSB employees rose to the challenge and stepped up to donate funds towards the goal.

Nurses from MHC, headed by Amanda Slaught and Jennifer Hutchinson, also joined the cause, donating hair and raising funds along with MHC staff members.

A number of community members also came aboard, donating funds, and coming out to the event to show their support and even deciding to donate hair on the spot.

The response was overwhelming and a total of \$6,290 was raised for the Canadian Cancer Society Transportation Program. Further funds came in after the event bringing the total to \$6,400. The hair goal was also exceeded, with 315 inches of hair from 23 different donors donated.

"We had five hair dressers who generously donated their time and skills to the event," said Ms. Wilkin. "A big thank you goes out to July Joy of Hair Care at

Home, Linda Case of Hair Trends, Denise Graham of Reflections Hair Studio, Dana Crane of Big Snips and Catherine Joyce."

Ms. Wilkin also thanked Andrew Orr of Orr's ValuMart who donated a large portion of the food for the barbecue at the event.
