## Municipal share of 2019 District Services Board budget sees an increase

ESPANOLA—Municipalities within the Manitoulin-Sudbury District Services Board (DSB) will see an increase in its share of the 2019 budget.

"The budget was approved in principle by the board," said Fern Dominelli, CAO of the DSB after a regular board meeting last week. "The budget was approved in principle, and when the new board is in place (next month) they will have the opportunity to review the budget and give final approval."

"The 2019 budget sees a \$116,604 increase in the municipal share, or a 1.13 percent increase," said Mr. Dominella. The overall DSB budget increase for 2019 is slated at 4.48 percent or \$1,610.658.

Mr. Dominelli explained, "last year's budget saw a decrease of 0.8 percent, but usually the budget will see a one or two percent increase. In 2017 there was a 0.4 percent in-
