RE: 2013 Ontario Budget: SSSMP Impacts

As you are aware, the government's 2013 Budget committed to transforming social assistance programs so they work better for the people who need them. The Budget announced a package of initial reforms that set the foundation for longer-term transformation.

Social Assistance Management System (SAMS) will provide us with a platform to support this transformation agenda, improve the administration of social assistance, and modernize the delivery of human services in the future. However, our capacity to absorb change at this advanced stage of the project life cycle is limited.

As a result, we are no longer targeting fall 2013 to implement SAMS.

The Project is now undertaking a comprehensive re-planning exercise to establish a revised project schedule. This will accommodate the social assistance changes announced in the Budget and also give us the opportunity to reconsider the timeframes required to support the successful implementation of SAMS.

We will work closely with you and share information on the revised implementation schedule in a fulsome and timely manner. At this time we do know that end-user training, which was to have started in mid-August, will not start any sooner than November 2013. More detailed information on the revised end-user training schedule will be shared when it is available.

Aside from end-user training, a key priority for our re-planning is to keep other local planning and preparation activities on the current track but with more time for completion. In this regard:

- The Project continues to target previously communicated timelines for trainthe-trainer B (June 3-28) and pilot participants (July 2-15).
- There is no change to the start date of manager/SME training but we are taking the opportunity to extend manager/SME training into the fall.
- We are still targeting late July for the pilot field test and will be providing pilot sites with more details regarding plans, scope and roles and responsibilities in the near future.
- All materials and support for Organizational Impact Assessments and data extracts will remain on the current timelines.
