WHEREAS NOSDA received funding from the Community Development and Homelessness Partnering Directorate (formally Homelessness Partnering Strategy) of Human Resources and Skills Development Canada to prepare a pre-feasibility report on the implementation of the Homeless Individuals and Families Information System (HIFIS); and
WHEREAS this project was successfully completed in July, 2014; and
WHEREAS it was found that the HIFIS system, as a shelter-based system, does not take into account the issue of 'hidden homelessness' and thus has limitations in relation to its inability to track homeless persons in Northern and rural areas; and
WHEREAS most Northern Ontario communities do not have any homeless shelters;
THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the following recommendations be adopted:
That the Federal and Provincial Governments work with NOSDA, Northern and rural communities to develop a more robust homelessness data collection system to enable greater service system management of the homeless population; and
That we ensure that the definition of homelessness being developed by the Provincial Expert Advisory Panel on Homelessness is reflective of northern and rural experiences of homelessness; and
That NOSDA members, in partnership and cooperation with the Federal and Provincial Governments increase their respective and collective understanding of homelessness through:
 ensuring service managers have the administrative capacity to collect and analyze homelessness data across Northern Ontario the development of reliable, accurate and meaningful homelessness data in Northern Ontario the facilitation of sharing and analysis of homelessness data in Northern Ontario, working in partnership with the Ontario Federation of Indigenous Friendship Centres to ensure service providers have cultural awareness training as it relates to the collection, application and use of homelessness data pertaining to aboriginal peoples, particularly the use and understanding of the term 'Aboriginal Indicator' when using HIFIS; and

WHEREAS it is appropriate to develop a policy that governs reimbursement of expenses occurred on behalf of NOSDA, and

WHEREAS a review of the expense policies of all DSSAB's and the City of Greater Sudbury was undertaken in February, 2015, and

WHEREAS that review provided NOSDA with an indication of the acceptable expense levels supported by its members.

Therefore be it resolved that the Northern Ontario Service Deliverers Association (NOSDA) reimburse staff and contracted individuals for any out-of pocket expenses, which have been incurred in the performance of their regular duties or on approved NOSDA travel, provided that the amounts claimed are deemed reasonable under the circumstances; and that

Members of NOSDA executive will be reimbursed for travel expenses based on the travel policies of the DSSAB/CMSM they represent; and

That Executive members of NOSDA will be reimbursed for travel on NOSDA business with the exception of the Annual General Meeting; and

That travel costs associated with the NOSDA Annual General Meeting will be covered by the DSSAB/CMSM the Executive member represents.

All others will be reimbursed based on the rates set and updated from time to time in the procedure attached and posted on the NOSDA website.

It is the intent of the Northern Ontario Service Deliverers Association (NOSDA) to reimburse staff and contracted individuals for any out-of pocket expenses, which have been incurred in the performance of their regular duties or on approved NOSDA travel, provided that the amounts claimed are deemed reasonable under the circumstances.

In establishing these rates NOSDA has reviewed the expense policies of all DSSAB's and the City of Greater Sudbury.

Members of NOSDA executive will be reimbursed travel expenses based on the travel policies of the DSSAB/CMSM they represent. The executive members of NOSDA will be reimbursed for travel on NOSDA business with the exception of the Annual General Meeting. It is NOSDA's expectation that travel costs associated with the NOSDA Annual General Meeting will be covered by the DSSAB/CMSM the executive member represents.

All others will be reimbursed based on the rates set in the procedure below

PROCEDURE

Business travel will take place in the most economic and time efficient manner.

 NOSDA will not reimburse any personal expenditure, which is not allowable under CRA rules.

Expense Reports

 Travel accounts must be submitted within 60 days and cannot be accumulated. Expense reports not submitted on time may not be reimbursed. Any expenses for the calendar year must be submitted before January 15th of the following year or will not be reimbursed.

Receipts

- All expenditures for which reimbursement is requested must be supported by original detailed receipts (not just credit card receipt).
- Should the original receipt not be available, a short written explanation should be noted
 on the expense claim. Payment of such an expense is at the discretion of the approving
 authority.

• Items for which receipts are not available such as gratuities and **kilometrage** should be deemed reasonable under the circumstances.

Use of Personal Vehicle

• Compensation for the use of an employee-owned vehicle will be made based on the **kilometrage** rates below. These rates are all-inclusive (usage, fuel, insurance, etc.):

 \$0.45 per km

 No reimbursement shall be made for traffic or parking violations, or items normally covered under a comprehensive personal vehicle insurance policy, or any insurance deductibles.

Accommodation Expenses

• The expenses actually incurred for overnight accommodations will be reimbursed provided that the standard accommodation is considered reasonable by the approving authority.

Meal Expenses

• The maximum per meal and/or per day is outlined below and includes all taxes and gratuities.
