Act, 2001 and City of Toronto Act, 2006 - Effective July 1, 2016/January 1,

2017

I am writing to inform you of recent regulatory changes under the: Housing Services Act, 2011 (HSA), Municipal Act, 2001 (MA) and City of Toronto Act, 2006 (COTA).

On March 14, 2016, the Province released the update to the Long-Term Affordable Housing Strategy (LTAHS Update).

The strategy update supports the vision that every person has an affordable, suitable and adequate home to provide the foundation to secure employment, raise a family and build strong communities and, continues the long-term transformation of Ontario's housing and homelessness system that began in 2010 with the release of Building Foundations: Building Futures – Long-Term Affordable Housing Strategy.

As committed to in the strategy update, the government is introducing a suite of regulatory amendments under the HSA, MA and COTA. Most of the regulatory changes will take effect on July 1, 2016, however certain provisions which will take effect on January 1, 2017. Please see Appendix A for an overview of these changes.

Section 50(3)	All scholarships, bursaries and fellowships received in connection with a student's enrollment in a post-secondary institution are exempt from a household's rent-geared-to-income calculation.
