

Low-Carbon Building Skills Call for Proposals

Ontario is taking steps to reduce greenhouse gases and meet key commitments in Ontario's Climate Change Action Plan (CCAP). On November 27, 2017, Ontario released three calls for proposals for projects to increase the capacity of Ontario's workforce to reduce energy use and carbon emissions.

Projects funded through the Low Carbon Building Skills (LCBS) initiative will support colleges and universities, unions, employers and other industry stakeholders to acquire new equipment and to increase their capacity to train current and future workers in low-carbon building skills.

- Ontario is investing \$24 million from the proceeds of the province's carbon market in this initiative.
- Organizations can only submit one proposal per funding stream as the lead applicant.
- Due date to submit is January 15, 2018. Agreements must be signed and activities started by March 31, 2018. All projects must be completed by December 31, 2018.
