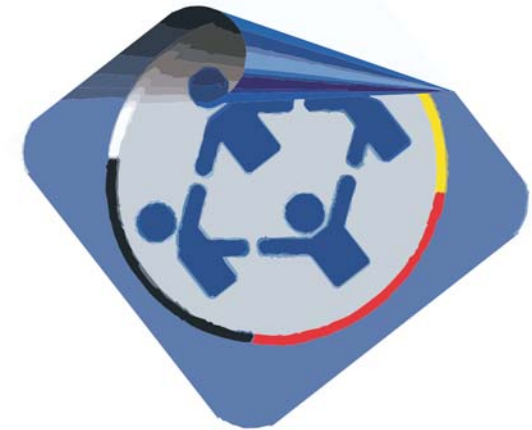

The Manitoulin-Sudbury DSB was created to oversee the social and community health programs that were transferred by the province to the municipal level. The DSB is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of elected officials from the organized municipalities and territories without municipal organization in the Manitoulin & Sudbury Districts. The Board is responsible and accountable for local policy and financial decisions regarding the delivery of these services. Through the DSB the communities we represent have more say over how social services are delivered to them.



## Emergency Medical Services

Our land ambulance services are stationed out of 12 communities with an additional 4 communities being served through Emergency First Response Teams (EFRT). Our EMS system responded to 13,100 calls in 2011 throughout the DSB area. These calls are responded to using a fleet of 31 vehicles which are staffed with either paramedics or EFRT members. Our total staffing pool approaches 135 individuals, all of whom are highly trained professionals dedicated to assisting persons in need in emergency situations.

## Social Housing

Providing clean, safe and affordable housing to residents requiring subsidized housing is our mandate. Seniors, singles, couples and families can access appropriate sized units in 11 communities throughout the DSB area. Rent is geared to income for our 1,2,3 and 4 bedroom units and is based on 30% of gross monthly income, or based on a rent scale if you are receiving assistance from Ontario Works or the Ontario Disability Support Program. The DSB's subsidized housing program can be found in Chapleau, Massey, Webbwood, Espanola, Little Current, Mindemoya, Manitowaning, Gore Bay, Warren, St. Charles and Noëlville.

## Ontario Works

Provides the help you need with employment and financial assistance while you take the steps necessary to find employment. Since different people have different needs, Ontario Works will work with you paying expenses for work clothes, transportation, giving you job experience, basic education upgrading, and job skills and training.

Homelessness - If you're a low income individual or family who is homeless or at risk of being homeless, you can apply to the DSB to help you retain your current accommodations or assist you in moving off the streets in to emergency or permanent housing.

## Children's Services

The DSB provides subsidies to parents in need who are working or engaged in a training or employment activity or for children with a demonstrated special need. We also have Best Start Hubs in Chapleau, Little Current, Espanola and Noëlville. These Hubs are access portals for information related to all children's service agencies. They also offer workshops, play groups and other services.

We cover the Sudbury and Manitoulin districts – an area spanning over 42,850 sq km!
